College Wide

Overall headcount (HC) enrollment for the Spring 2007 term increased by 5.5% compared to the previous year (2006 HC = 16,464 students versus 2007 = 17,369 students). This was comprised of a 4.1% growth in full-time (FT) HC (2006 = 5,854 vs. 2007 = 6,095) and a 6.3% expansion in part-time (PT) enrollment (2006 = 10,610 vs. 2007 = 11,274). Accompanying the HC rise was the 5.7% increase in total FTE (2006 = 11,125.7 FTE vs. 2007 = 11,762.8 FTE).

Nearly two out of three (65.6%) students college-wide were female, continuing a pattern found in recent years. A total of 11,387 females (up 5.4%) were registered compared to the 5,982 male HC (up 5.6%). Minority enrollment outpaced the overall increase as this population grew by 9.9% (2006 = 2,877 vs. 2007 = 3,163). Asian HC experienced the largest proportional increase at 11.7% (2006 = 486 vs. 2007 = 543) followed by Hispanics (2006 = 866 vs. 2007 = 963 or 11.2%), African Americans (2006 = 1,475 vs. 2007 = 1,604 or 8.7%), and American Indians (2006 = 50 vs. 2007 = 53 or 6%). By comparison, the White population grew by 4.9% (2006 = 12,996 vs. 2007 = 13,637).

When considering program major, students continued to select those that provide career/technical training over the transfer option. Nearly three in five (57.7%) were career students while another one in seven (14.3%) selected the General Studies major. In contrast, just over one in four (28.0%) were in a transfer curriculum (2006 = 28.7%). Both nursing programs (RN and LPN) and Business Management were the most popular career majors while Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice topped the transfer program selections.

In addition to reporting the approved PA Department of Education (PDE) campuses, enrollment information will be reviewed for the Virtual Campus (VC) and the York Center. These locations are not included in the official data reporting to PDE, but their profiles can be found in Appendix A (VC) and B (York).

Harrisburg Campus

Enrollment grew by 2.9% at the Harrisburg Campus (2006 = 9,193 vs. 2007 = 9,459) with the PT population up 4.2% (2006 = 5,712 vs. 2007 = 5,954) while the FT HC remained fairly flat (2006 = 3,481 vs. 2007 = 3,505 or 0.7%). As a result, total FTE was up by 2.4% (2006 = 6,335.8 FTE vs. 2007 = 6,409.9 FTE).

Just over three in five students at the Harrisburg location (61.6%) were female. This percentage represents the lowest female percentage of the four campuses and is in keeping with recent trends. There were 5,826 females and 3,633 males enrolled at the Harrisburg Campus.

Total minority HC was up 3.7% (2006 = 1,730 vs. 2007 = 1,794) and constituted nearly one in five Harrisburg students (19.0%). American Indians had the largest percentage increase (2006 = 27 vs. 2007 = 29 or 7.4%), though their total numbers were not large (N = 29). Asians had the next highest proportional increase (2006 = 316 vs. 2007 = 330 or 4.4%) with Hispanics (2006 = 330 vs. 2007 = 344 or 4.2%) and African Americans following (2006 = 1,057 vs. 2007 = 1,091 or 3.2%). White HC was 2.7% higher by comparison.

Most students (56.5%) selected a career/technical program as their major and another one in seven (14.1%) were enrolled in the General Studies curriculum. Transfer majors comprised three in ten students (29.4%). Similar to the college-wide distribution, the most popular career

programs were in nursing (RN and LPN) and Business Management while Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice had the largest number of transfer students.

Gettysburg Campus

Enrollment at the Gettysburg Campus rose 3.1% (2006 = 1,465 vs. 2007 = 1,510) with FT HC up 4.4% (2006 = 453 vs. 2007 = 473) and the PT total 2.5% higher (2006 = 1,012 vs. 2007 = 1,037). The increased HC resulted in a 4.6% rise in FTE (2006 = 959.1 FTE vs. 2007 = 1,003.6 FTE).

Females continued to comprise a large minority of Gettysburg students as nearly three in four (73.4%) of the population were female. This adhered to recent trends, as a total of 1,108 females and 402 males were enrolled at Gettysburg for the Spring 2007 term.

Another characteristic which has changed little from year to year is the proportion of minority students found at Gettysburg. Overall, minorities were 8.3% of the total, up from 7.1% the previous year. Total minority enrollment grew by 21.2% (2006 = 104 vs. 2007 = 126) with the largest percentage increase associated with Asian students (2006 = 12 vs. 2007 = 23 or 91.7%), then American Indians (2006 = 5 vs. 2007 = 7 or 40.0%), African Americans (2006 = 30 vs. 2007 = 38 or 26.7%), and Hispanics (2006 = 57 vs. 2007 = 58 or 1.8%). Though the numbers and proportion of minorities at Gettysburg are the smallest of the four campuses, these numbers continue to exceed those associated with Adams County, the primary service region.

Nearly one in four (24.7%) students were in transfer programs compared to more than three in five (62.8%) in career majors and the remainder in General Studies (12.5%). Nursing (both RN and LPN) and Business Management were the most popular career choices while Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice had the largest transfer totals.

Lancaster Campus

Strong increases were again characteristic of the Lancaster Campus enrollment as total HC was 11.2% higher (2006 = 4,800 vs. 2007 = 5,336). This was comprised of a 11.2% increase in both FT (2006 = 1,593 vs. 2007 = 1,771) and PT (2006 = 3,207 vs. 2007 = 3,565) enrollment. The FTE total rose to 12.8% (2006 = 3,182.8 vs. 2007 = 3,589.7) as a result of the HC increase.

Females represented seven in ten (70.2%) students, a percentage that has held fairly stable over the past five years. For the Spring 2007 term, 3,744 females and 1,592 males were enrolled.

The minority population continued to grow as it comprised one in five (20.1%) Lancaster students (2006 = 18.5% of total). Overall growth was 20.9% (2006 = 886 vs. 2007 = 1,071) and this was led by a 26.0% rise in African Americans (2006 = 346 vs. 2007 = 436), 21.3% with Asians (2006 = 141 vs. 2007 = 171), 16.7% among Hispanics (2006 = 266 vs. 2007 = 330), and 6.7% for American Indians (2006 = 15 vs. 2007 = 16).

In terms of program choice, the distribution nearly mirrored those found college-wide. Career majors were the most popular (58.3%) with transfer programs (26.3%) and General Studies (15.4%) far behind. Likewise, Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice were the most popular transfer programs while nursing (RN) and College-Based Radiologic Technology led the career major count. The LPN curriculum came in third.

In considering these totals for the Lancaster Campus, a caveat must be noted. A significant portion of the Lancaster population is enrolled at the York Center. Once York obtains branch campus status, this will have a profound impact on the Lancaster total, as those attending York will be excluded from the Lancaster count. Again, it is important to emphasize that the present "home campus" code (those locations approved by PDE) overstates the Lancaster totals.

Lebanon Campus

The total HC at the Lebanon Campus grew by 5.8% (2006 = 1,006 vs. 2007 = 1,064) with the FT count up 5.8% (2006 = 327 vs. 2007 = 346) and a corresponding 5.7% increase in the PT figure (2006 = 679 vs. 2007 = 718). This had the effect of raising FTE by 4.7% (2006 = 648.0 FTE vs. 2007 = 678.4 FTE).

A profile of the Lebanon Campus population revealed that two in three students were female (66.6%). This percentage has remained fairly stable over the past three years and closely matches the college-wide figure. For the Spring 2007 term, 709 female and 355 male students were enrolled.

Minority enrollment grew by 9.6% (2006 = 157 vs. 2007 = 172) and this increased minority representation at Lebanon from 15.6% of the total last year to 16.2% this year. The increase in minority HC was led by Hispanic students (18.9%) and Asians (11.8%). Both African Americans (-7.1%) and American Indians (-66.7%) experienced declining totals.

The program distribution did not change greatly from year to year. For this spring term, most students selected a career major (57.8%), with transfer options next (28.9%) and then General Studies (13.3%). Popular career programs included nursing (RN), Business Studies, and Early Childhood Education. Among transfer majors, Elementary Education, Business Administration, and Criminal Justice enrolled the most students.

Summary

HACC continued to grow in the Spring 2007 term when compared to the previous year. The 5.5% increase produced 17,369 students, a record high for this semester.

It is notable that HACC remains a strong draw for both females and minorities. The former now comprises nearly two-thirds of all students (65.6%) while nearly one in five (18.2%) are found in the latter group. The shift to career/technical programs, which began in earnest in 2001, continued in the Spring 2007 term as nearly three in five have selected majors in these fields. Huge increases in the nursing programs (RN and LPN) over the past five years can be attributed, in large part, to the overall growth at HACC.

On a campus-by-campus basis, the largest increase was associated with the Lancaster Campus (11.2%) followed by Lebanon (5.8%). Given this information, it is vital to emphasize that the "home campus" code was employed for the four PDE approved locations. Students enrolled exclusively in Virtual Campus or York Center courses were included in the totals based on their home campus code. As such, the Virtual Campus and York Center counts were tabulated based on the enrollments generated at each site and their totals were reported in Appendix A (Virtual Campus) and B (York Center) respectively.

Appendices

Appendix A - Virtual Campus

A total of 3,327 students registered for at least one Virtual Campus (VC) course. This is a 0.8% increase from the Spring 2006 total (N = 3,301). The FT enrollment declined by 4.6% (2006 = 1,114 HC vs. 2007 = 1,063 HC) while PT registration expanded by 3.5% (2006 = 2,187 vs. 2007 = 2,264). The 3,327 VC students produced 4,822 registrations, which generated 14,235 credits. These figures were both down 1.8% (2006 = 4,911 registrations) and 1.1% (2006 = 14,399 credits) respectively.

In considering the above, it is important to state two points. First, the enrollment HC are duplicated – students may be counted multiple times if enrolled in multiple locations. Second, the generally flat enrollment total is directly related to the number of qualified online faculty and the number of courses available. The VC courses have proven to be very popular, but enrollments cannot be easily increased when there is a limited number of faculty and popular courses are at their maximum level. Finally, the vast majority of VC courses are offered online (94.2% of all registrations) and by 2008 the video course option is scheduled to be inactivated.

A profile of the VC students showed that females comprised nearly three-quarters (72.5%) of the total while one in eight were minorities (12.4%). The mean age came to 28.7 years and nearly one-third (32.0%) were FT students. About two-thirds (65.1%) were enrolled in at least one VC and one traditional course. Only a third (1063/3327 or 34.9%) were taking a VC course only.

The program selections of VC students were similar to the college-wide results. The most popular majors were nursing (RN), Business Management, and Computer Information Systems among the career options while Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice remained the largest transfer programs.

Appendix B - York Center

Prior to reviewing the York Center totals, several important factors should be discussed. Like the VC, the HC totals are duplicated, i.e. students attending multiple HACC locations will be counted multiple times. Secondly, most students (1211/1494 or 81.1%) have cited the Lancaster Campus as their home campus for reporting purposes, and this has lead to an overcounting of Lancaster students. Once branch campus status is achieved, this will address the duplicated HC problem. Lastly, the rapid and large increases reported for York is characteristic of the other locations during the early years of their development.

The York Center experienced a 39.9% increase in total HC (2006 = 1,068 vs. 2007 = 1,494) with the FT figure up 35.3% (2006 = 394 vs. 2007 = 533) and the PT count 42.6% higher (2006 = 674 vs. 2007 = 961). The 1,494 students produced 3,749 registrations (40.9% increase; 2006 = 2,660 registrations) which generated 10,648 credits, up 43.3% from the 2006 total of 7,431 credits.

Nearly three-quarters of the population were females (74.6%) and more than one in six were minorities (17.5%). The mean age of York students was 27.4 years. By program choice, both nursing (RN and LPN) programs were the most popular career majors while Business Administration and Criminal Justice were selected by the largest number of transfer students.

not unexpectedly, the overwhelming majority of students came from York County (1377/1494 or 92.2%).

The rapid growth and high proportion of local citizens utilizing the York Center provided the sound basis to move forward with the PDE application for branch campus status approval.
