### **College Wide**

Overall enrollment at Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC) increased by 4.5% compared to the previous spring term, as the headcount (HC) totaled 18,152 for 2008 vs. 17,369 for 2007. One significant factor affecting the four established campus HC totals was the approval of the York Center to full campus status by the PA Department of Education (PDE). With campus status, the placement of students from the other four sites (Gettysburg, Harrisburg, Lancaster, and Lebanon) who attended York were migrated to their "home" location.

Given the PDE approval for York, it was not surprising that the four existing campuses experienced a decline in HC. Baseline data for York will be established during the first year and it is likely that a decline in HC may result in the coming Fall 2008 term for some, if not all, of the established locations. This will be especially true of the Lancaster Campus as the bulk of the former York Center students were assigned to this location.

The 18,152 Spring 2008 student population was a record high for this term and this continued the growing HC trend that began in Spring 2001. Overall increases between full time (FT) and part time (PT) students were fairly similar. Among the FT population, a 4.1% increase was found (Spring 2007 = 6,095 FT students vs. Spring 2008 = 6,347 FT), with the PT totals growing by 4.7% (2007 = 11,274 vs. 2008 = 11,805). The overall 4.5% jump in HC translated to a 4.6% increase in the Full Time Equivalent (FTE) count (2007 = 11,762.6 FTE vs. 2008 = 12,304.2).

By gender, females continued to constitute nearly two in three students (65.4% or 11,878/18,152). This changed little from the 65.6% total the previous spring. Minority HC experienced strong growth among Hispanic students with a 12.5% increase (2007 = 963 vs. 2008 = 1,083), while African Americans rose by 5.0% (2007 = 1,604 vs. 2008 = 1,684). The American Indian HC rose 11.3% but their overall total remains quite small (2007 = 53 vs. 2008 = 59). Finally, Asian student enrollment was nearly identical from year to year (2007 = 543 vs. 2008 = 545, or 0.4%). An increase of 6.5% was associated with total minority enrollment (2007 = 3,163 vs. 2008 = 3,371).

The largest career programs were Registered Nursing (RN), Business Management, and Practical Nursing (PN). The two nursing programs included the Pre and Non-Clinical majors. In terms of transfer majors, Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice enrolled the most students. Results for the academic major distribution mirrored those associated with the Spring 2007 data.

### **Harrisburg Campus**

The Harrisburg Campus saw a 3.1% decline in total HC (2007 = 9,459 vs. 2008 = 9,168) compared to the Spring 2007 term. The FT HC was down 2.8% (2007 = 3,505 vs. 2008 = 3,406), with the PT total off by 3.2% (2007 = 5,954 vs. 2008 = 5,762). The FTE count fell by 2.7% (2007 = 6,490.9 vs. 2008 = 6,314.8) as a result of the drop in HC enrollment.

Females constituted just over three of every five students (5,568/9,168 or 60.7%), similar to 2007. By ethnicity/race, only the Hispanic students increased their total from the previous spring (2007 = 344 vs. 2008 = 356 or 3.5%), as the Asian (2007 = 330 vs. 2008 = 311 or -5.8%) and African American (2007 = 1,091 vs. 2008 = 1,077 or -1.3%) HCs were lower. American Indians experienced a drop of 20.7%, but again their absolute total was small and this often results in large variance (2007 = 29 vs. 2008 = 23). Overall minority enrollment declined by 1.5% from year to year (2007 = 1,794 vs. 2008 = 1,767).

The career and transfer majors that enrolled the most students changed little from 2007. Among career programs, the nursing (RN) major remained the most popular (also includes Pre and Non-Clinical), with Business Management – General and Practical Nursing (also Pre and Non-Clinical) following. The RN program remained the largest of <u>all</u> majors at the Harrisburg and all other campuses.

Transfer majors were found in greatest number in Business Administration. This was followed by Criminal Justice and Elementary Education. Except for the order, all of the top transfer and career programs mirrored the previous year.

## **Gettysburg Campus**

Total HC at Gettysburg declined for the first time in more than eight years, as 2.7% fewer students enrolled (2007 = 1,510 vs. 2008 = 1,469). The number of FT students was down 5.8% (2007 = 473 vs. 2008 = 445), with the PT population falling 1.3% (2007 = 1,037 vs. 2008 = 1,024). Given the recent approval of York Center as a branch campus by PDE, it is likely that some of the enrollment lost can be attributed to the placement of students in the new location rather than at the Gettysburg Campus. Total FTE fell by 2.2% (2007 = 1,003.6 vs. 2008 = 981.3) to reflect these declines.

Adhering to past trends, more than seven in ten students were females (1,059/1,469=72.8%). The Gettysburg Campus historically has enrolled proportionally more females than any other location, but was surpassed by the new York Campus this term. Among minority students, a strong increase was registered for Hispanics (2007=58 vs. 2008=68 or 17.2%), but African Americans (2007=38 vs. 2008=26 or -31.6%) and Asians (2007=23 vs. 2008=22 or -4.3%) experienced a drop in HC. American Indian HC rose by 57.1% but the total numbers were very small (2007=7 vs. 2008=11). Minority enrollment generally has been the smallest proportionally at Gettysburg compared to the other campuses (8.6% or 127/1,469) and this reflects the overall population in Adams County. Nevertheless, total minority HC increased slightly from the previous spring (2007=126 vs. 2008=127 or 0.8%).

Not unexpectedly, both nursing (RN and PN) programs and Business Management were the most popular career majors, while Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Psychology led the transfer options. This matched the previous year's list except for Psychology which replaced Criminal Justice.

### **Lancaster Campus**

The 14.0% decline in enrollment (2007 = 5,336 vs. 2008 = 4,590) was primarily due to the York Center's approval as a branch campus and transferring these student HCs to the newly approved site. Without a doubt, the Lancaster Campus was impacted more by the York approval than any other campus. As such, over the next year, revised enrollment baselines will need to be established to accurately depict what is actually occurring at the Lancaster Campus.

In terms of FT HC, a drop of 17.1% was computed (2007 = 1,771 vs. 2008 = 1,469), with the PT enrollment down by 12.5% (2007 = 3,565 vs. 2008 = 3,121). These findings directly impacted the FTE totals which declined by 15.7% (2007 = 3,589.7 vs. 2008 = 3,027.5).

While the actual female HC total fell due to the transfer of many Lancaster students to their new York location, the proportions changed very little. For the Spring 2008 term, females again

comprised nearly seven out of every ten students (3,163/4,590 or 68.9%). Again, total minority HC was adversely affected with transfers to York (2007 = 1,071 vs. 2008 = 935), but proportional representation remained steady at nearly one in five (935/4,590 or 20.4%). The largest group was the Hispanic population (N = 446) followed by African Americans (N = 311), Asians (N = 162), and then American Indians (N = 16).

While the RN program remained the most popular career major, Radiologic Tech and Practical Nursing likewise remained the second and third largest. No change was found with transfer programs either, with Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice again coming in as the top three.

It is impossible to fairly assess the Lancaster Campus enrollment without emphasizing again the tremendous influence the York Campus had on both the distribution and HC totals. Clearly, the development of new enrollment baselines must be completed over a one year period before reliable and valid comparisons can be made.

## **Lebanon Campus**

Enrollment at the Lebanon Campus fell slightly by 1.0% (2007 = 1,064 vs. 2008 = 1,053). The 9.5% growth in FT HC (2007 = 346 vs. 2008 = 379) could not fully cover the 6.1% lost in the larger PT population (2007 = 718 vs. 2008 = 674). However, the robust growth in FT students produced a 4.3% increase (2007 = 678.4 vs. 2008 = 707.3) in the FTE count.

By gender, females continued to constitute nearly two-thirds of the population (717/1,053 or 68.1%), a finding little changed from the 2007 results (66.6%). Strong inroads were made with minority enrollment, as the total was nearly one in five (193/1,053 or 18.3% vs. 16.2% in 2007). Hispanics again comprised the largest minority group (N = 116, up 2.7% from 113 in 2007), followed by African Americans (2007 = 39 vs. 2008 = 50 or 28.2%) and then Asians (2007 = 19 vs. 2008 = 22 or 15.8%). American Indians rose from one to five students (400.0%).

Nursing (RN) was the largest career major, with Business Studies and Early Childhood Education following among career programs. Elementary Education again was the most popular transfer major, with Business Administration second. Unlike 2007 in which Psychology was the third largest, this term the Social Sciences major moved up to this slot.

#### **York Campus**

The recently PDE approved York Campus began its official enrollment history with a total HC of 1,872 students. The number of FT students constituted just over a third of the population (648/1,872 or 34.6%), with the remainder registered as the first PT class (N = 1,224).

When considering gender, females were nearly three out of every four students (1,371/1,872 or 73.2%). The female percentage for York was the highest of any campus, just exceeding the Gettysburg figure. The first York census identified a minority contingent that constituted 18.6% of the population (349/1,872). The largest group was African Americans (N = 220), with Hispanics (N = 97), Asians (N = 28), and American Indians (N = 4) following. Clearly the opening of York provided expanded educational opportunities for all in the county, but this was especially true of minorities who enrolled more than twice their proportional county-wide total (based on 2000 Census).

Career majors were led by Nursing (RN), Dental Hygiene, and Practical Nursing. For transfer programs, Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice were the most popular. In each case, the listing of the largest academic majors generally reflected the findings at other campuses and college-wide.

### **Summary**

New highs in total HC and FTE were established in 2008 for the spring term. Also, HACC continued to educate more minority students. On an individual campus basis, a decline was experienced by all established locations due to PDE's approval of York as a branch campus and the transfer of students from other locations to the new site. Lancaster Campus in particular was affected far more than other locations and new baselines for enrollment will be established over the next year.

Career programs continued to be the most popular, with both nursing majors (RN and PN) remaining two of the largest. Business Administration and Elementary Education again topped the list for transfer majors.

## **Appendix**

#### Virtual Campus

Enrollment at the Virtual Campus (VC) continued to show strong growth, as the total HC increased by 28.2% (2007 = 3,327 vs. 2008 = 4,266). This HC total generated 6,683 registrations (2007 = 4,822 or 38.5%) and 19,652 credit hours (2007 = 14,235 or 38.1%).

The unduplicated HC distribution showed that about one-third of the VC population was enrolled FT (1,406/4,266 or 33.0%) and just over a third (1,570/4,266 or 36.8%) were enrolled solely in one or more VC courses. None of these proportions differ greatly from the Spring 2007 finding (FT = 32.0%; VC only = 34.9%).

Minority enrollment constituted about one in every eight students (544/4,266 or 12.8%), with African Americans the largest group (N = 288) followed by Hispanic students (N = 148) and then Asians (N = 93). Females continued to represent a large majority (3,102/4,266 or 72.7%) and the mean age of all VC students was 28.5 years.

By home campus, the largest group was associated with Harrisburg (N = 2,307), with Lancaster (N = 907) and York (N = 439) following. Not surprisingly, Dauphin County was the home county of residence for the largest group (N = 955), with York (N = 840) and Lancaster (N = 808) closely following.

Reflecting the results college-wide and also by campus, the most popular career major of VC students was nursing (RN) and then Business Management. Business Administration and Elementary Education were the most popular transfer programs.

The VC courses again experienced a large increase in HC, as many students found that this instructional format best met their scheduling and program needs. It does <u>not</u> appear that the VC has reached a saturation point since nearly all courses offered quickly fill. This is especially true of core and college-wide required courses (e.g. English 101) as the rapid expansion of VC continued unabated.
