The petition is part of Advance PA: Community Colleges Leading the Way, a communications and advocacy campaign that was launched at PA Community College Lobby Day at the State Capitol on April 27. HACC student Matthew Martin and HACC trustee Charles Peguese helped to kick off the statewide campaign by speaking at a press conference and rally organized by the Pennsylvania Commission for Community Colleges.
