Helping HACC Students Achieve a Promising Future



In speaking with Linda Enders Dolan and her brothers, Don and Jim Enders, it's clear how much the three siblings truly enjoy one another. Aside from the playful sibling banter and affection for their large, extended family, these Lower Paxton Township natives couldn't speak enough about their commitment to quality education in the region, especially *their enthusiastic support of HACC.*

HACC has been a part of the Enders family for nearly 50 years. The College launched each of the siblings, as well as their children, on a trajectory to achieve - and exceed - their educational goals. Their personal journeys describe these HACC-inspired successes:

- As a high school senior, **Linda** was intent on a degree in art education. Her father suggested she begin at HACC, then the new community college in Harrisburg. Linda spent one year taking college courses, during which she experienced the 1967 move to the new campus and then transferred to Millersville to earn a Bachelor of Science in Art Education. She later received her master's degree in art education and her doctorate in educational leadership and curriculum development from the University of Pennsylvania. Linda spent her career as a teacher and as an administrator, occasionally teaching continuing education courses at HACC. With her husband, Mark, also an educator, they have two daughters, both of whom attended classes at HACC as they pursued bachelor degrees.
- Focused on a college-prep track, **Don** was concerned about financing his education and joined the Pennsylvania Army National Guard after high school. He returned after

serving one year to attend HACC and graduated with an associate degree in 1972. He continued at Penn State Harrisburg for a degree in business administration and then joined his father at Enders Insurance Associates, where he now serves as president and CEO. Don and wife Anna Maria, an educator, have two children who attended classes at HACC. He served on the HACC Foundation Board from 2007 until 2016 and was a member of the Foundation's Planned Giving Committee and the Joint Board Development Task Force.

- **Jim** earned his associate degree from HACC in 1979, later receiving a bachelor's degree in business administration from Bloomsburg University. He joined Don at Enders Insurance, where he developed expertise in flood and cyber liability insurance. Two of Jim's three children took courses at HACC as well. Jim volunteers at HACC, where he is involved in the scholarship review process and participates in the Frank J. Dixon Tournament for Scholarships.

What has compelled the Enders family to be champions of HACC over the years?

Like so many others who have experienced HACC first-hand, the family views the College and its outstanding faculty as an invaluable resource in the region. Linda describes the school as "truly a gem in the community." Don continues, "I am excited to promote HACC and *always* tell high school students and parents to **consider HACC as a high-quality, low-cost educational option.**" He takes great pride in every HACC graduate who has touched lives in the region, especially when discovering that a nurse or other professional attended HACC. "So many lives are touched by those who were trained at HACC."

Linda, Don and Jim also shared their thoughts on the quality of HACC's student body. Jim, who has worked extensively with student volunteers, explained, "They understand the meaning of professionalism, and it's clear that they learn this from the institution."

This immense appreciation for HACC and its students has led to the establishment, in 2010, of the Enders Family Scholarship Endowment, which provides vital funding for students to continue at HACC on a full-time basis and receive their degrees without interruption so that they, too, can achieve – and exceed – their career goals. The family recognizes how greatly needed this program has been for HACC students by the letters of appreciation they receive.

At HACC, we are so very appreciative of the exceedingly generous contributions of the Enders family and their commitment to providing accessible quality education for students at HACC.

Dental Laboratory Fund to Support New Dental Laboratory at HACC's Harrisburg Campus

A well-designed treatment space will allow practitioners to maintain a healthy working posture and maintain access to necessary equipment while maintaining safe and effective proximity to the patient. 

Major Richard D. Winters Memorial Scholarship



In December 2016, the Major Richard D. Winters Memorial Scholarship was established through a fundraising party hosted by Ed Lynch.

Mr. Lynch wanted to start a scholarship that was devoted to veterans who attend HACC's Lebanon campus. Mr. Lynch has a connection to Major Winters through his father-in-law, who knew Major Winters. Ed was inspired to start this scholarship after attending the bronze statue dedication in Lebanon for Major Winters. The scholarship gives consideration to students who meet specific criteria, including those

students who are active duty or former active duty members of the U.S. Armed Services, including the National Guard. Students must also be enrolled at HACC's Lebanon Campus.

Who is Major Richard D. Winters? Major Richard Davis "Dick" Winters (Jan. 21, 1918 – Jan. 2, 2011) was an officer of the U.S. Army and a decorated war veteran. He is best known for commanding Easy Company of the 2nd Battalion, 506th Parachute Infantry Regiment, part of the 101st Airborne Division, during World War II, eventually being promoted to major rising to command of the entire 2nd Battalion.

As first lieutenant, Winters parachuted into Normandy in the early hours of D-Day, June 6, 1944, and later fought across France, the Netherlands, Belgium and eventually Germany. In 1951, during the Korean War, Winters was recalled to the Army from the inactive list and briefly served on staff at Fort Dix, New Jersey. Winters was issued orders for deployment and was preparing to depart for Korea but instead left the Army under a provision that allowed officers who had served in World War II and who had been inactive since to resign their commission.

Winters was discharged from the Army and returned to civilian life. He was a regular guest lecturer at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point until his retirement in 1997. He was the last surviving Easy Company commander. Winters was featured in a number of books and was portrayed by actor Damian Lewis in the 2001 HBO mini-series *Band of Brothers*. Despite the many accolades he had received, Winters remained humble about his service. During the interview segment of the miniseries *Band of Brothers*, Winters quoted a passage from a letter he received from Sergeant Mike Ranney, "I cherish the memories of a question my grandson asked me the other day when he said, 'Grandpa, were you a hero in the war?' Grandpa said 'No.... but I served in a company of heroes'."

The establishment of the Major Richard D. Winters Memorial Scholarship will allow his legacy to live on through the HACC students that are able to benefit from this scholarship.

Gettysburg Hospital Foundation Provides Scholarships for Physician Office Assistant Program Students



HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College, is a leader in the region's healthcare education. Offering both credit and noncredit programs, HACC prepares the health professionals that likely serve you and your family.

HACC recently established a fund to provide scholarships to students enrolled in HACC's Physician Office Assistance program (POA). This noncredit program was initially developed as a result of a collaboration between HACC, WellSpan Medical Group and the South Central Workforce Investment Board (SCWIB). The POA program is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills needed to work in the front office of a WellSpan primary care practice, specialty care practice or the access call center. Throughout the program, students learn about medical insurance, electronic medical records and the importance of possessing excellent customer service and critical thinking skills.

The POA program provides an opportunity for underprivileged individuals to train for a rewarding career that is in high demand. Thanks to the Gettysburg Hospital Foundation, six HACC POA students will each receive a \$1,500 WellSpan-supported scholarship, with preference given to WellSpan employees and/or their family members.

Veterans and Active-Duty Military Personnel Enrolled at HACC Eligible for Scholarship Funds

HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College, proudly has **more than 1,200 active military and veterans studying in the classroom or through virtual learning, making HACC** the second largest active military and veteran population among public colleges and universities in Pennsylvania. While many veterans and active-duty military personnel are eligible for postsecondary education payments under the G.I. Bill, the funds provided by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs may not cover all of the costs.

HACC recently established a fund to provide scholarships to veterans and active-duty military personnel enrolled at HACC. The HACC Veterans Scholarship Fund is the result of proceeds received after a fundraising letter was mailed to veteran's organizations in Central Pennsylvania. This scholarship fund will give students who qualify some additional assistance to pay for tuition, books, fees and program expenses while enrolled at HACC.

To be eligible for the scholarship:

1. Students must be veterans of the U.S. military or active U.S. military personnel.
2. Students who are veterans must have been honorably discharged.
3. Students who are active military personnel must be in good standing.
4. Preference will be given to students with unmet financial need.

Here at HACC, we strive to provide the needed support to all enrolled students to ensure their success. This is just one way we are supporting veterans and active-duty military personnel. Your contributions to this fund will help provide even more support.




Congratulations to these students!

While Helen Hauser did not know how to make wine or hard cider, she could grow anything in her garden. As far back as her family can remember, Helen had a garden and a greenhouse. As the years went by, the garden got smaller and the greenhouse was less used, but even as a nonagenarian, Helen managed to grow fruits and vegetables at her home. She always had fresh fruit available to eat or create pies and jellies.

Helen was present when the Hauser family planted their first vineyard at Hauser Estate Winery and would often help trim the vines. As she advanced in years, her trips to the vineyards became limited. Instead, she sat in the tasting room at the Winery and greeted people as they entered. The Hauser family is confident that Helen would be proud of the fact that the Helen Hauser Memorial Scholarship is helping students cultivate their love of agriculture and create a product out of fresh fruit.

Gettysburg – Gettysburg Campus Phi Theta Kappa Establishes Scholarship to Assist Fellow Students

HACC's Gettysburg Campus Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) students have a long history of philanthropic support to community organizations through donations to Survivors Inc., Relay for Life and the American Heart Association as well as donations to the Alpha Nu Omega/Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society Scholarship fund.

In 2011, Gettysburg Campus PTK students decided they also wanted to support students locally at the Gettysburg Campus. Gettysburg Campus PTK students, along with PTK advisors Wendy Brubaker and David Bailey, invited a representative from the HACC Foundation to meet with them to discuss options for establishing a scholarship for PTK students on the Gettysburg Campus.


The primary source of funding for this first scholarship came from a prom dress sale that the students organized to benefit local high school students, a holiday bazaar featuring outside

vendors, gift wrapping and bake sale items provided by PTK members and a ladies' night out event featuring local vendors with products geared toward women. These events raised enough money to award the first \$250 scholarship to Gettysburg Campus student and PTK member Tammy McKim in 2012 and Christine Morningstar in 2013.

Gettysburg Campus students remained committed to continuing the scholarship and set about raising more money to meet the \$3,000 annual scholarship requirement. The students worked closely with their advisor, Professor Catherine Frost; the campus vice president, Shannon Harvey; the business director, Kathy Brickner; and the campus director of student development, Jessica Knouse, to discuss fundraising strategies. After two years of fundraising, Gettysburg Campus PTK students were finally able to meet their fundraising goal during the collegewide Day of Giving on April 21, 2016. In August 2016, the Gettysburg Campus PTK liaison, Timothy Mullen, and the Gettysburg Campus PTK advisor, Catherine Frost, signed the memorandum of understanding officially establishing the HACC Gettysburg Campus Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship award to benefit a Gettysburg Campus PTK student.

4. Select the link Email Alerts under Shortcuts
5. Select the Register Me box if you are not a registered user. Follow instructions on the page. Note: your registration will be accepted within 24 hours. Skip this step if you are already a registered user.
6. Log in with your User ID and Password, if you are already a registered user. If you are not a registered user, select the Register Me box and follow the instructions (Allow 24 hours for registration).
7. Follow the instructions on the page by selecting your Notification Preferences
8. At the bottom, select Email Me.
9. Type in the security letters that you see inside the box below the letters
10. Select Submit

Note: You will begin to receive emails from the newsroom about the topics you selected. It will include the name of the news release in the subject line of your email. The body of the email will have the news release title, dateline, an article abstract and a link to the full release in HACC's online newsroom.
