

The Harrisburg Bureau of Police has completed its investigation into the alleged indecent assault reported at HACC's Harrisburg Campus on Nov. 18, 2013, and determined that <u>NO crime occurred</u>. There is <u>NO suspect at large</u> and <u>NO continuing danger to the campus community from this incident.</u>

This is an unfortunate situation, because we take reports from students and employees seriously. False allegations such as these undermine legitimate reports, and they are unprofessional and disrespectful. They hurt the College and waste time that could be used educating our students. All false reports in the future will be dealt with aggressively by HACC and law enforcement.

We will continue to act quickly to notify our students and employees for the safety of the HACC community. HACC students and employees often travel between campuses, so we will continue to alert people through e2Campus alerts and email across all of HACC's campuses. Also, we will continue to take all reports seriously in the future. While our hope is that incidents do not occur, we want people to come forward and report them when they do. Students and employees should not hesitate to contact HACC Safety and Security with any concerns.

While unfortunate situations happen occasionally, the reality is that our campuses are safe. Also, your safety and security will continue to be our top priority. Thank you.
