ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

At HACC you will find:

English as a Second Language Program (ESL)

The ESL program offers four levels of instruction from beginning to advanced. Classes meet 15 hours a week with emphases on speaking, listening, reading and writing skills.

Career Programs

Career programs require four or more terms of full-time study to complete and include courses providing concentrated study in a particular field and general education; enable students to enter a career immediately upon graduation.

Transfer Programs

Transfer programs provide the first two years of education for a four-year bachelor's degree. Top transfer schools for international students include Penn State University, Shippensburg University, Millersville University, York College of Pennsylvania and Temple University, but credits are easily transferred nationwide.
