Battle of Cedar Creek, Virginia

Following the Union defeat in the Battle of New Market in the spring of 1864, federal control of the Shenandoah Valley was reestablished under Philip Sheridan. Having convincingly defeated Confederate forces in the fall of 1864, Sheridan left his army camped along Cedar Creek at Middletown and made preparations to go to Washington to consult with Gen. Grant. Sheridan's travel plans were rudely interrupted by Jubal Early and his army of about 17,000 in what became the last major battle in the Valley. We will highlight the major personalities and events that became known as the Battle of Cedar Creek. *No refunds after February 12.*

Early in World War II, the War Department realized the need to train US troops for fighting under the harshest conditions and to be able to withstand the rigors of battle over rough terrain and inhospitable climates. In April of 1942, Major General George S. Patton, Jr., opened the Desert Training Center, California-Arizona Maneuver Area (DTC-CAMA), in the Mojave Desert. Before the facility closed in May of 1944, it trained 400 military units and over 1 million soldiers.
