### SESSION I 8:30-10 a.m.

<b>1-A</b>	<b>Theodore Roosevelt and the Great Canal</b>	<b>Dr. Donald G. Koones</b>
	In 1904, a tremendous engineering project began to create a shortcut between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans via the Western Hemisphere. The goal was a 50-mile canal that would ultimately cost millions of dollars and thousands of lives. The origin of this incredible endeavor and final success can be attributed to an outstanding United States president, Theodore Roosevelt. Come learn more regarding this fascinating individual and this incredible achievement.	
<b>1-B</b>	<b>Writing Your Life Story</b>	<b>Jim Rada</b>
	Finding out who you are related to is just the first step in genealogy. Your descendants will be more interested in finding out what kind of person you were. Learn how to tell the story of your life. You'll find out the types of details to include that give your autobiography context, the types of stories to look for, how to recall the key events in your life, and how to put it all together.	
<b>1-C</b>	<b>Ella Fitzgerald – "The First Lady of Song"</b>	<b>Jim Held</b>
	Ella Fitzgerald joined the Chick Webb Band at age 16 and soon became its major attraction. Her songbook albums with the music of Gershwin and Cole Porter were probably her masterpieces.	
<b>1-D</b>	<b>Sam Houston</b>	<b>Roger Swartz</b>
	This year marks the 175 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Texan Revolution against Mexico in 1836, which includes the Battle of the Alamo. Topics in this session include Houston's road to Texas, his military and political involvement in the revolution against Mexico, his last-ditch victory over Santa Anna at San Jacinto, and his role as president of the Republic of Texas.	
<b>1-E</b>	<b>Mary Jemison, French and Indian War Survivor</b>	<b>Debra McCauslin</b>
	On April 5, 1758, Thomas and Jane Jemison's homestead was plundered by Shawnee and Frenchmen at dawn and the family was captured and taken west. The family was murdered during the march, but 16-year-old Mary was spared and later adopted by two Seneca women. Several opportunities arose where she could have been liberated, but she refused to go back and spent a long life in the Native American culture with her family. Learn about this amazing woman's story of sorrows and triumphs.

	Continuing with the Texan Revolution theme, topics of this session include biographical sketches of Travis and Bowie; how each man got to the Alamo; the Battle of the Alamo on March 6, 1836; and myths and realities of the battle and of their lives.	
<b>2-F</b>	<b>Adams County's Hidden Treasures</b>	<b>Debra McCauslin</b>
	Adams County is well known for the Gettysburg battlefield, but it also has many fascinating, beautiful, scenic and interesting places. Some highlights include the Adams County Fruit Belt, Michaux State Forest, Appalachian Trail, the statue of Mary Jameson, old stone and wooden bridges, early churches, and other landmarks that you may not be aware of.	
<b>2-G</b>	<b>From Inspiration to Motivation!</b>	<b>Holly Cookerly, RN</b>
	What does it take to motivate you to change your health behavior? This program will discuss inspirational "triggers" which may help you to change those behaviors that have challenged you! Come to this session to get some great ideas and explore what it takes to get you motivated.	
<b>2-H</b>	<b>"What did you do in the war, Dad?"</b>	<b>David Fleischer</b>
	Follow one man's search for his father's WWII story. This presentation is the culmination of a 12-year personal journey. From my Father's induction into the US Army just after Pearl Harbor through to the end of the War, the story is told through artifacts, period photographs taken by my Father, and my matching "today" photos for a "then and now" comparison. It is a tribute to all of the front-line soldiers of the Greatest Generation.

	The International Sweethearts was the first integrated all-women's band in the United States. During the 1940s the band featured some of the best female musicians of the day. Earl Fatha Hines described them as the First Freedom Riders.	
<b>3-E</b>	<b>David Crockett and the Alamo</b>	<b>Roger Swartz</b>
	The final session of the Texan Revolution series includes a biographical sketch of Crockett; the Battle of the Alamo on March 6, 1836; and Crockett and the Alamo throughout out history. Was Crockett killed—or captured? Pros and cons of this argument will be analyzed.
