We want you to be aware of upcoming changes to the nursing program. **All students accepted into nursing clinicals beginning Fall 2018 will be required to follow the new curriculum.**

**If you are applying for clinicals beginning prior to Fall 2018 (Spring 2018 or Summer 2018) you will follow the current curriculum requirements.**

Our goal is to help you navigate these changes to best prepare you to complete the program without taking classes that may not be needed.

Here is an overview of the changes:


<b>Currently required for an Associate of Arts in Nursing – clinicals beginning prior to Fall 2018</b>	<b>Required for an Associate of Science in Nursing effective Fall 2018 clinical start</b>
Elective	No longer need an elective
PE/Wellness	PE is no longer required
Sociology 201	No longer required. <i>May be required in the RN to BSN program you choose</i>
Psychology 209	No longer required
Demonstrate math competency to the college level, but no college math was required	Math 103 or 202 required. <i>Recommend 202 as is required in all RN to BSN programs</i>
No first year seminar requirement	First Year Seminar required
Biology 121, 122 and 221	No change
English 101 and 102	No change
Communication 101	No change
Psychology 101	No change
Core A Elective	No change <i>Recommend Spanish 104</i> <i>Check the RN to BSN program of your choice as some require 200 level courses to transfer.</i>
All Nursing Courses (37 credits)	No change

Students will be considered for admission into the nursing program who have:

- Documented high school diploma or GED or equivalent foreign education as verified by a HACC-approved credential evaluation service. Final official high school transcript must be on file in the Records Office.
- 2.5 program or overall GPA
- TEAS score 58.7 or higher
- Successful completion of all developmental coursework (C or better) - eligible for English 101 and Math 103/202
- Completed 2 science courses, one with a lab (high school or college)
- Met with a nursing advisor or health career counselor, reviewed and signed the Nursing Essential Qualifications and signature page (retain a copy for your records)
