EMS Academy

\$1,250

The EMS Academy has been designed to ensure the highest level of training to potential Emergency Medical Service providers for successful entry into the field.

The HACC EMS Academy is a full time program, primarily scheduled Monday through Friday, however, the commitment may include some evenings and weekends. This concentrated program requires over 400 hours of training. Attendance is mandatory and it is recommended that candidates do not hold employment while attending the Academy.

All candidates enrolled in the HACC EMS Academy are expected to meet the academic, practical and physical development standards set forth within the Academy. The Academy is operated with strict guidelines established for cadet behavior, attitude, and interaction. For training purposes the Academy does have a command structure. Cadets will be required to assume in-class leadership roles during the Academy. Cadets are exposed to daily and weekly academic testing and physical exercise and development. Although not a pre-requisite, preparatory physical exercise will greatly enhance a cadets ability to meet the physical rigors of Academy training.

Students do not need prior knowledge of Emergency Medical Services. Upon successful completion of the program, Academy graduates will have obtained the following:

- Pennsylvania Department of Health Emergency Medical Technician certification
- Emergency Vehicle Driver Training (EVDT)
- Assessment of Treatment and Trauma
- Blood Borne Pathogens (BBP)
- Hazardous Materials Operations (IAFF)
- Pediatric Emergency Assessment Recognition and Stabilization (PEARS)
- Advanced Cardiac Life Support for the EMT-Basic (ACLS for the EMT-B)
- National Incident Management System components (Overview, IS 100, IS 200 and IS 700)

Additional training will be provided in vehicle extrication and rescue practices. Academy cadets will be required to spend time in clinical rotations at various EMS agencies where they will be expected to function as a member of an EMS crew.

For consideration for admission to the HACC EMS Academy, the following must be received by the HACC EMS Education Unit by application deadline:

1. Proof of minimum age of eighteen (18) at time of entry.
2. Proof of a high school diploma or state recognized equivalent.
3. Successfully pass the Nelson-Denny reading test. This exam is held periodically at the HACC Shumaker Public Safety Center. There is a \$15 fee for the test. Dates will be provided upon request.
4. A statement from a physician indicating that rigorous physical activity is not prohibited as well as completed Health Examination Form.
5. Proof of medical insurance coverage.
6. An application for admission as provided by the HACC Shumaker Public Safety Center.
7. Current copy (dated within one year of application) of the following background checks in accordance with Act 34 and Act 151 as amended.
 - (a) Pennsylvania State Criminal History Record

 - (b) Department of Public Welfare Child Abuse Report

8. Three (3) letters of reference from non-relatives. At least one must be a Healthcare Provider/Professional.
9. Submit a copy of applicant's complete 3 year driving record from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

Once the HACC EMS Academy Application and all required documents are received, candidates will be scheduled for an oral interview. This oral interview will be conducted by the HACC EMS Academy Admissions Board. All applicants will be notified by mail of their final determination. Application and interview does not guarantee acceptance into the program. Upon acceptance, tuition fee must be paid in full or proof of Financial Aid application must be received before the start of the Academy.

Applications will not be accepted after January 14, 2011.

Certification Training

Registration for all certification courses closes two weeks prior to the start date. No on-site registrations will be taken.

EMT Basic Emergency Medical Technician \$300

An Emergency Medical Technician includes the knowledge and skills required to provide basic pre-hospital emergency care. This program serves as the foundation for emergency medical services. This course teaches students the overall roles and responsibilities of the EMT; an overview of anatomy and physiology; assessment of injuries and illnesses; cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR); control of bleeding and shock; care of musculo-skeletal injuries; medical emergencies; childbirth; pediatric emergencies; environmental emergencies; lifting and moving of patients; automated external defibrillation; and assisting patients with their own prescribed medications. Also included are the skills needed to assess the scene, and properly move and transport patients to the emergency department. This course includes a scheduled Pennsylvania Department of Health practical and written examination which, if passed, will provide Pennsylvania certification as an EMT.

Program Admission Requirements

Minimum age to enter the class is sixteen (16) years of age. It is mandatory that students under the age of eighteen (18) must have a parent or legal guardian present at the first session of class. A parent/guardian needs to provide signatures for a criminal history background check and other paperwork required in the class. No refunds will be issued after the first night of class unless for major medical or military reasons. Students will need to have a Photo ID available at all state examinations.

This is a noncredit certificate program. It is not a requirement of the HACC EMT program to have a GED or High School diploma, however, some employers require it upon hiring EMTs. Students must be able to lift, carry and balance a minimum of 125 pounds equally distributed (250 pounds with assistance), at a height of 33 inches and a distance of 10 feet. A State Police Criminal Record Check will be obtained; reading and writing skills must be at or above a 9th grade level.

Length of Program

HACC's EMT basic program is 140 hours in length. Students may be dismissed after missing 14 hours of class time (10%).

Tuition includes a Jones and Bartlett EMT textbook, a pocket mask, and a stethoscope. Workbooks are optional and may be purchased by calling (717) 780-1979.

First Responder to EMT-Basic Bridge \$175

The course will be 80 hours and will provide all skills necessary to effectively bridge into EMT-B. The candidate successfully completing the bridge program will be eligible to take the approved Pennsylvania DOH practical and written exam for EMT.

First Responder \$175

Pre-Hospital Registered Nurse (PHRN) \$1500

The Pre-hospital Registered Nurse (PHRN) program is intended to provide a comprehensive knowledge base, practical skill training and field experience for a Registered Nurse to become a competent entry level provider in the Emergency Medical Services field. Emphasis is placed upon the students' professional and clinical experience prior to enrolling therefore a solid foundation in Anatomy & Physiology, Pharmacology and Cardiology is recommended. Students must be a licensed Registered Nurse. All candidates are required to interview with the Program Coordinator prior to acceptance. *Tuition includes all required textbooks.*

CPR Basic Life Support for the Healthcare Provider \$65 American Heart Association

Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers covers core material such as adult and pediatric one and two-rescuer CPR, use of a face shield and a bag mask to deliver ventilation support to patients, foreign-body airway management, and using an automated external defibrillator.

The target audience for this program is the healthcare provider, or student entering the healthcare field, also EMS personnel, physician assistants, doctors, dentists, nurses, and respiratory therapists. A written exam and a skills test are required for successful course completion. *Tuition includes an AHA CPR BLS textbook. Pediatric Emergency Assessment, Recognition and Stabilization (PEARS) \$ 75

American Heart Association

PA DOH CE Credits: EMT 5 (5 M/T)/ALS 6.5 (6.5 M/T)

The Pediatric Emergency Assessment, Recognition, and Stabilization (PEARS) course was designed for healthcare providers that infrequently see critically ill children. PEARS prepares a student to assess, categorize, decide and act early to stabilize the child. The main focus of PEARS is prevention, and specifically the assessment, recognition and stabilization of pediatric victims at risk of severe cardiopulmonary distress. Key topics covered are pediatric assessment, respiratory compromise and arrest recognition and management, circulatory compromise and arrest recognition and management, shock recognition and management, and resuscitation team concept. Tuition includes the AHA PEARS textbook.

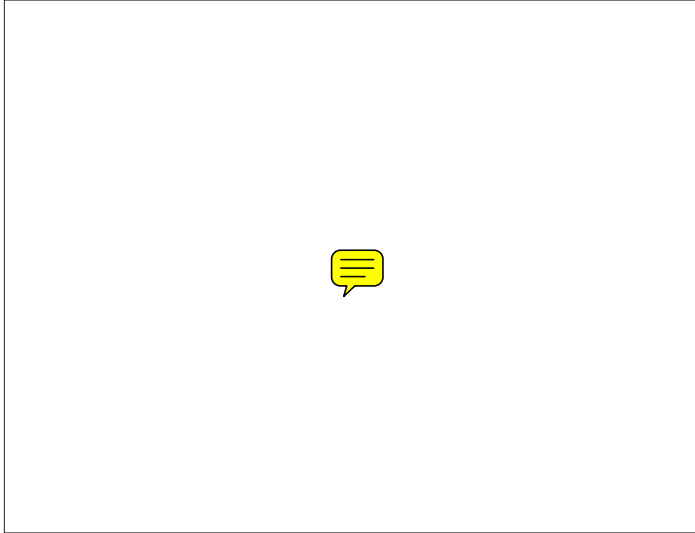

Our Challenge

The Shumaker Public Safety Center has rarely seen a break in activity since it was built more than 20 years ago. Naturally, the building and training grounds are showing their age and limitations.

Significant upgrades and renovations to the building and grounds are critically needed to develop a safe, state-of-the-art educational facility and to protect our communities in an increasingly dangerous world. The Public Safety Center Master Plan recently identified four distinct phases of expansion that extend over a 20-year period. The first phase, to be completed by December, 2011, focuses on remedies to targeted areas in need of the most immediate attention.

Phase I of the project includes:

- Construction of a LEED®-certified Law Enforcement Complex to include an indoor firing range. Deterioration has severely limited the ability to use the facility for training. A state-of-the art firing range will allow an additional 200 students access to the facility and expand services to additional organizations and agencies.
- Renovation of the six-story fire training tower, smoke structure, and burn building to meet and exceed safety standards and provide additional training access for municipalities and expansion of services for rescue programs.

Directions to HACC's Senator John J. Shumaker Public Safety Center

Directions from West Shore or Carlisle: Take I-81 north to Cameron Street Exit 67A. From Cameron Street, turn right at the first traffic light. Go through the next traffic light, and go to Entrance # 5 (Public Safety Training Center). If traveling north on Route 11, continue on Routes 11-15 north to I-81 (north of Enola). Follow I-81 north across the Susquehanna River, then take Cameron Street Exit 67A. Go through the next traffic light, and go to Entrance #5 (Public Safety Training Center).

Directions from Downtown Harrisburg: Take Second Street north to the 2100 block and turn right onto Maclay Street. Follow Maclay Street east across the railroad bridge to the traffic light at the Farm Show Building. Turn left onto Cameron Street and travel north to the next traffic light. Turn left and go through the next traffic light, and go to Entrance #5 (Public Safety Training Center).

Directions from the North: Take Routes 11-15 south following the Susquehanna River to I-81. Follow I-81 north across the river then take Cameron Street Exit 67A. From Cameron Street, turn right at the first traffic light. Go through the next traffic light, and go to Entrance #5 (Public Safety Training Center).

Directions from Upper Dauphin Area: Take Route 147 south or Route 225 south to Route 322 (River Relief Route). Route 322 becomes Cameron Street after crossing I-81. 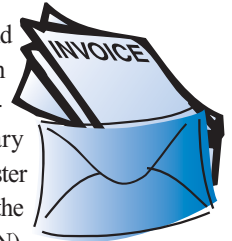
