This Addendum is hereby made part of the Request for Bid No. 10-53 dated May 28, 2010 for the above referenced bid. The provisions of this Addendum are intended to supplement the provisions and scope of work and/or supersede them where contradictory thereto.

This Addendum contains changes to the requirements of the Scope of Work. Such changes shall be incorporated into the Scope of Work and shall apply to work with the same meaning and force as if they had been included in the original Request for Bid. Where this Addendum modifies a portion of a paragraph or phrase of the Scope of Work, the remaining unmodified portion of the paragraph or phrase shall remain in force.

### 1.1 ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS:

- a) Question: Page 3, 1/3 from bottom - it states Copy will be provided in high resolution PDF's yet it also mentions all the other pre-press information – please clarify?

Answer: PR/or assigned freelancer will supply a high resolution PDF, and we provide all of the pre-press/spec information to successfully print the tabloid.

- b) Question: Page 2 "Method of Printing" states Sheet fed or Cold press Web - will you accept heat set press work?

Answer: Yes - heat set press work is acceptable. But most sheet fed or Web presses are cold press.

- c) Question: Why is it called Tabloid when it measures 6 x 10.5. Is it just the name of the project?

Answer: PR will provide a mailing list by addresses. And the bundles by route are acceptable, or 50's etc. Mailings must be prepared according to the USPS guidelines.

- d) Question: The bid is very clear that if it was delivered to the USPS the printer has to repair all errors to bring the mailing into compliance. If the is 6 x 10.5 - it is considered a Slim Jim. Most Slim Jim get 3 tab closures put on to get better mail rates. If it is a Slim Jim per mail regulation are that the cover has to be 60 lb. Please clarify?

Answer: The mailing must be prepared according to USPS regulations, and it does get tabbed in 3 locations with clear 1 ½ " tabs – no perforation on the tab. All of the paper weight specifications are correct. We have never had problems with the Post Office accepting these tabloids....except when improperly prepared for mailing.
