Often overlooked and underestimated, our closest ally and largest trading partner, Canada, offers intriguing alternatives to the American way of life. This interdisciplinary sociology course provides a general introduction for students outside of Canada to Canadian society and culture, the city of Toronto, and themes and issues relevant to city life and urban sociology.

Canada, one of the most urbanized nations in the world as a result of its geographic conditions and historical development, and Toronto, one of the most multicultural cities in the world, will be explored in depth through lectures, discussions, and field visits to sites in Toronto and outlying regions. Topics will include Canada's economic and political history,

significant societal institutions, ethnic/racial diversity and relations, Canada's Aboriginal peoples, as well as urban design, planning, and the environment, using Toronto as a model and resource.
