On January 14, 2003, our first class of 24 students began the RN nursing program at the Gettysburg Campus. This spring marks the 10 year anniversary of our program. Today, we have 108 students enrolled in the RN program. Since 2008, 99% of our Associate Degree graduates, who have taken their licensure exam, passed on their first attempt.
