





"Where you are influences your art," says York County artist Robert Patierno, whose woodcut prints - just one of the media in which he works - is being highlighted in an exhibit that opened Monday, Jan. 9, 2017 in the East

Patierno was one of the founders of the Pennsylvania College of Art & Design, and worked at the school for two decades, retiring in 2003.

The woodcut prints in this current exhibit, some black and white and some color, depict everyday thngs like animals, trees, water, birds...it's a process of taking ordinary life and moving it into a statement about civilization and culture," Patierno says.

"People respect art. It's inherent. It's the highest form of human communication," he says. "I want to influence people. I want to influence their lives."

Faculty Service Award Winners

During HACC's Lancaster Campus Week 0 activities on Wednesday, January 11, three faculty members were recognized with the campus' inaugural **Faculty Service Awards**.

Jim Bath, Health/Physical Education, was recognized for his multiple efforts to support wellness and physical education instruction at HACC's Lancaster Campus. Those efforts include being a key organizer of the campus' annual 5K fun run since its inception, helping plan the campus' fitness trail by researching equipment and laying out the route and activities, and consulting administration on appropriate safety protocols in the PE room.

Karen Green, Education/Foundational Studies, was recognized for her outstanding work to showcase the education field to current and prospective education students on campus. Since her first semester teaching at the college, Karen has put together a non-traditional educational careers panel every term that has been open to all. The panels bring together five to seven representatives from county private schools, Head Start, childcare center operators, early intervention, and ESL to network and interact with students. Karen has also been a consistent participant in campus open houses and CITE presenter.

Ilene Rosenberg, Art History/Humanities, was recognized for her leadership with the campus Art Committee. These volunteers work with area artists and the campus to arrange around five exhibits in the campus Art Space each year. For many years, Ilene has handled all publicity work in partnership with the college's Office of College Advancement and is the liaison to campus administration. She also led the effort to select and hang photographs of various Lancaster County scenes in the Community Room of the Main Building. Ilene has also been a regular participant in campus open houses.

All three honorees are adjunct faculty whose work for the campus has been completely voluntary. We cannot thank them enough for all their efforts to enrich the lives of our students and indeed the campus as a whole. **THANK YOU!**
