HACC Receives Nearly \$1.3 Million Gift for STEAM Programs



What would you do with a gift of nearly \$1.3 million?

On April 10, 2019, HACC leaders announced a transformational gift of \$1,295,305.30 from the estate of Mrs. Gloria W. Paxton. In accordance with Mrs. Paxton's wishes in her last will and testament, the gift was used to establish the <u>John E. Paxton and Gloria W. Paxton Fund for Excellence in STEAM.</u>

Dr. Ski, HACC's president, said, "It is the largest single contribution to HACC and the HACC Foundation in the College's 55-year history and will impact all HACC campuses, Central Pennsylvania and the world. Mrs. Paxton left 70 percent of her estate to HACC. We received the gift last month. While the Paxtons did not have children of their own, the impact they will have on approximately 18,000 students at HACC cannot be overstated."

We appreciate the Paxtons more than words can express and will never forget their life-changing generosity.

Inspiring Others Through Memorial Contributions

Recently, the HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College, and the <u>HACC Foundation</u> have received memorial contributions for members of our College community, including the late Professor John Atella, Dr. Michael Klunk, Mr. Ron Rebuck and Mrs. Joyce Roebuck. We are forever grateful for their generosity and the impact that they have made on HACC, and we are grateful to those who memorialized them by making a financial contribution to support our HACC students.

Professor Atella was a senior professor of business administration at HACC. Upon his retirement in 2000, Professor Atella earned the prestigious emeritus status. After his passing, his family preferred memorial contributions be made to the HACC Foundation, in lieu of flowers, to impact current and future HACC students.

Dr. Klunk was instrumental in establishing several of HACC's campuses, including the Lancaster Campus, where he served until his retirement from HACC. His impact is felt throughout the College. Through the establishment of the HACC Foundation's Michael B. Klunk Award in honor of his retirement, Dr. Klunk's philanthropy has provided life-changing opportunities for HACC students. Most recently, Dr. Klunk served as HACC's Lancaster Campus fundraising campaign chair. His legacy at HACC as both a treasured administrator and influential volunteer will carry on for years to come. We are so grateful that he chose to devote his expertise, time and energy to make HACC a better place. Dr. Klunk will be missed by many at HACC and beyond.





Mr. Rebuck began his relationship with HACC as a transitional licensed practical nurse (LPN) seeking advanced standing in the Associate Degree RN Program. Graduating with an associate degree in nursing from HACC in 1980, Mr. Rebuck went on to build a career as an exceptional psychiatric nurse. His love of HACC drew him back, and in 1992, he began his full-time career with HACC as a faculty member in the Practical Nursing Program. In 2002, Mr. Rebuck transitioned into the role of director of programs on the

Harrisburg Campus. He was a loyal friend, respected colleague and passionate student advocate (especially for males in nursing). The HACC and nursing communities mourn his loss.

Mrs. Roebuck was a graduate of John Harris High School and the Polyclinic Hospital School of Nursing. Mrs. Roebuck was a nurse at Polyclinic and Harrisburg Hospitals and a substitute nurse at Central Dauphin Schools. Upon her passing, in lieu of flowers, she had requested donations to HACC's Nursing Program to support the education of future nurses. Mrs. Roebuck's generosity and giving heart will live on through the students who aspire to become nurses.

HACC and the HACC Foundation are so very grateful for all of the memorial contributions that we have received. We are also grateful to the families who recommended these memorial contributions. We will certainly miss these individuals, and they will live on in our hearts and through their commitment to HACC.

Area Dentist and Philanthropist Changing the Lives of HACC Students

Shipley Energy Establishes New Scholarship Fund for HACC CDL Students
