


HARRISBURG CAMPUS FACILITY UPDATES

PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY

In April, the Department of Public Safety & Security (DPSS) conducted two "shelter in place drills". Choosing to take shelter is necessary in many emergencies.

Taking appropriate shelter is critical in times of disaster. The safest locations to seek shelter vary by hazard. There may be situations, depending on your circumstances and the nature of the disaster, when it's simply best to stay where you are and avoid any uncertainty outside by "sheltering in place".



The exercise went well without any issues on DPSS behalf. Twelve officers and dispatch took part in the exercise that involved the Rose Lehrman Arts building and Midtown 1. Officers physically locked exterior doors and posted signs informing of an exercise. Dispatch successfully remotely locked all keycard access doors. The mass notification system worked without a hitch for the Rose Lehman Arts building. Officers went through the building in three teams checking for compliance with the drill. The drill only took 15 minutes from start to finish at each location. At the Midtown 1 building an issue arose with the telephone alert system and that issue has been resolved. It is imperative that staff, faculty, and students take these drills seriously! DPSS plans on conducting these types of drills each semester.

DIVERSITY SPOTLIGHT & UPCOMING EVENTS



Students from local high schools took part in a panel discussion about gun violence and our youth.

This summer, the Community Diversity Forums continue with participation from our area's young leaders! June's topic was gun violence and its impact in local schools and neighborhoods. The moderator and panelists represented a range of local school districts from Central Dauphin, East High, SciTech, and PA Cyber Charter School and brought with them diverse perspectives based on age, race, ethnicity, religion, and personal experience. Notable themes and comments included discussion of division within schools and how to prevent future gun violence, the daily fear (or de-sensitization) students feel, how threats made as a joke make it hard to differentiate between real and not

real, and the need to foster stronger community-police relations and trust, particularly with children of color. The most recent Community Diversity forum was held on July 19 at the PA Coalition Against Rape and focused on social media and our youth. The next forum will be held on Aug. 16, 8-10 a.m. at the PA Coalition Against Rape. This months discussion will be on racism and discrimination from the perspective of community youth. All are welcome to join us.

Mental health is a college stumbling block. For students of color, it can be a wall





On June 15, HACC Harrisburg Campus hosted its first of the Summer Movie Under the Stars series! There were over 500 in attendance!


