



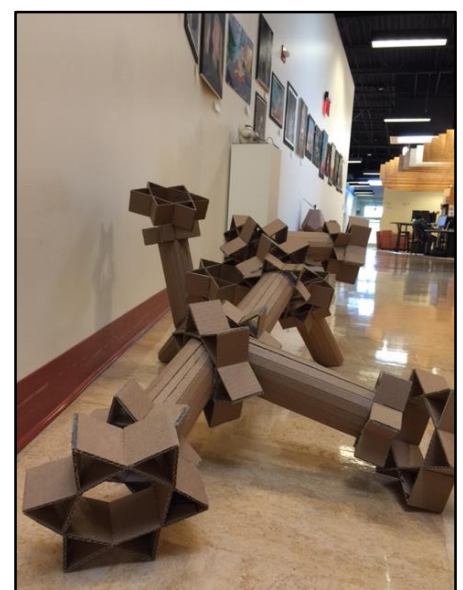
SPRING ARTS SPLASH

Ashley C. and Alexandria P. were among those who took a “time out” in the hustle and bustle leading up to finals. Students, faculty, and staff made approximately 112 pounds of all-natural playdough. During live cooking demonstrations, counselors encouraged students to think about how they can destress and talked about importance of paying attention to their overall wellbeing. Students were provided with bags of playdough to take home and challenged to think about other ways they can keep their children occupied while they hit the books. Adult coloring pages were also available to students. Didn’t get a chance to participate? Here’s the recipe:

Homemade Playdough

3 cups of flour	1 ½ cup of salt
3 cups of water	9 dessert spoons of cooking oil
6 teaspoons of cream of tartar	Food coloring, as desired

Mix all ingredients, except food coloring. Add food coloring. Keep mixing until lumps have been blended.

Put the mix in a sauté pan and cook it slowly over a medium heat, stirring continuously. Take it off the heat when dough starts to come away from the side of the pan.

Remove the dough from the pan (very hot) and knead it on a hard surface/place mat. It will be messy/goopy at first, but keep working at it and it will congeal.

Let cool and then store in a sealed container/bag. Does not need refrigeration.

TUTORING AND TESTING UPDATE

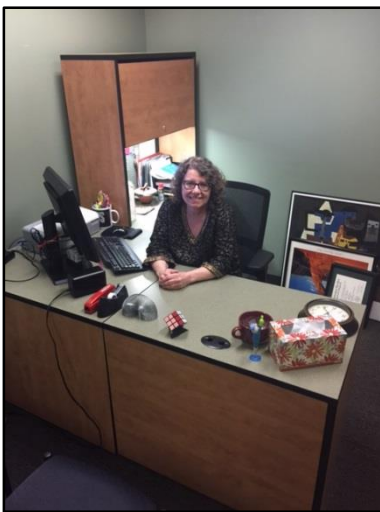
