





FACILITIES UPDATE

McCormick Library HVAC Improvements

The McCormick Library will be undergoing heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) improvements during the month of October. The month of October was strategically selected due to the moderate temperatures and limited need for HVAC. Throughout the construction, there will be no hot water or heating and cooling. We do not anticipate this to be a problem for occupants within the building. However, there is work scheduled from Oct. 6 through October 19 where the circulating fan will be inoperable. During that time the facilities department will monitor the building to proactively identify any issues and address them.

To minimize impact on students, the library has identified a variety of solutions during the period October 6 through October 9, with alternative options for accessing computers and printing. Information will be distributed to the students as October 6 approaches. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we continue to improve our facilities.

Weeds? What weeds?

Several people have been wondering what those weeds are in the west parking lot. Well it turns out those "weeds" are actually rain gardens. When the west parking lot was designed we incorporated several best water management practices (BMPs) that enhanced our



sustainability efforts. Throughout the west parking lot there are rain gardens that capture rain water and delays the storm water from draining into the Paxton creek. They provide several benefits including pollution control, flooding protection, and habitat conservation.

Helen Y. Swope Carillon and Clocktower



The Helen Y. Swope Carillon and Clocktower was recently refurbished through the generous support of the Harrisburg Student Government Association. The original carillon, which was installed in the mid 80's, broke nearly a year ago. The campus sought to fix the carillon but parts were no longer available. During the summer a mason was brought in to replace broken bricks and repoint the mortar. Additionally, a new digital carillon was installed along with four new clock mechanisms. The new digital carillon is much more user friendly and easier to maintain. The campus has been enjoying

the west minster bell chimes and a host of new music since the start of fall classes.



Live at Rose Lehrman Launches New Website and Branding






