

Spring 2016 is well underway!

I am pleased to announce our "117 challenge" last fall achieved positive results. While online student success rates did not quite reach equivalency with face-to-face student success, the achievement gap narrowed by another 1%. The fall 2015 gap was -1.68% compared to -2.72% for fall 2014. Even more encouraging is the percentage of HACC's online students earning A-C grades in fall 2015 reached its highest rate in the last *seven* fall semesters while serving more online students than any previous fall. "Growth with integrity" is what I hope each of us keeps in mind at HACC-Virtual Learning.

Over the past semester, I heard stories and read emails from various faculty who shared how they reached out to students who may have been challenged in their online classes; I heard stories about the effectiveness of Starfish (see page 4 for tips on how to schedule appointments through Starfish); and I heard stories about how the IT Support Center continued to improve their support for online students. Thank you to each of you! Your efforts clearly made a difference.

Please continue your good work and know the Virtual Learning staff is here to support you. Never hesitate to reach out. - Amy Withrow

Work Begins on One Button Studio

Lebanon Campus, in conjunction with Academic Technologies and supported by the generous funding support of the HACC Foundation, has begun work on its exciting One Button Studio project! Upon completion, this project will provide faculty, students, and staff with an easy-to-use solution for recording video lectures/presentations at the touch of a button.

Modeled after Penn State University's existing One Button Studios, this dedicated recording space will sport a whiteboard, an ultra-short-throw projector hooked up to a computer for slideshows and presentations, high-grade lighting, and more. Walk into the space, plug in your USB drive, hit the button, and away you go! When you're finished, hit the button again, take your USB drive, and leave the space with your video ready to use.

While this will obviously help online and blended faculty produce videos for their classes, it could also easily be used for augmenting web-enhanced classes, recording student work for presentation assignments, creating video resume components for students entering the job market, and any number of other creative purposes to enhance teaching and learning.

This project has an anticipated completion timeline of Fall 2016, with training support available to faculty on how to use this space. User feedback will help shape future upgrades and capabilities of this space.

For the first time in our institution's 51-year history, HACC is providing six full-ride scholarships. One full-ride scholarship was available for each of the five campuses and Virtual Learning. The full-ride merit scholarship was created by the HACC Foundation to provide scholarships to graduating high school seniors enrolled full time at HACC. Funding will be provided for two years allowing a student an opportunity to complete an associate degree. The scholarship covers tuition, books and fees for one full academic year with eligibility to renew each year up to six consecutive terms. Virtual Learning Student Satisfaction Survey

Determining how to improve online student success is a worthy goal. This past fall 2015 term, student affairs distributed a Virtual Learning student satisfaction survey. The results from this and past surveys allow Virtual Learning to obtain a thorough view of learners' insight into issues that affect the student experience. Data are used to analyze and provide a clear picture of how to improve student development, learning, and success.

Did You Know? *

- **63.3%** of online students use a portable laptop as their primary device to compete online coursework. Desktop use, as a primary device, has declined from **48.5%** to **25.2%** over the past five years.
- **55.4%** of online students stated they selected online education due to challenges fitting oncampus courses into their work and/or personal schedules. "Less travel" was the second most common reason at **30.8%**.
- **43.8%** of online students prefer an e-book compared to a print textbook. This percentage has changed very little over the past four years.
- **42.1%** of online students first learned about HACC's online courses and degrees through the hacc.edu website. This is the primary way students learn about online education at HACC.
- **29.1%** of online students indicated they would pursue online education elsewhere if HACC did not offer the online coursework they needed.
