

## Harrisburg Area Community College Spring 2010 Student Profile

### College-Wide

New highs were established in the Spring 2010 term as student headcount (HC) reached 21,556 college-wide. This was an increase of 11.3% over the 2009 HC (N = 19,363) and marked the tenth consecutive year of spring term growth. Full time (FT) enrollment rose by 15.0% (2009 = 6,934 vs. 2010 = 7,973), while part time (PT) HC was up by 9.3% (2009 = 12,429 vs. 2010 = 13,583). Reflecting the stronger FT HC growth, total FTE was 13.6% higher (2009 = 13,186.3 vs. 2010 = 14,977.8).

Similar to previous years, females again constituted nearly two out of every three students (13,558/21,556 or 64.9%). The previous year's college-wide percentage was nearly identical (64.8%), but variations by campus can be found and will be reviewed later in the report.

Overall, 1,788 Hispanic students enrolled, or 8.3% of the total. This figure was higher than the 1,441 total in 2009 (7.4%). By race, minorities were 18.0% (N = 3,872) of the college-wide population. The largest groups were African Americans (N = 2,466) followed by Asians (N = 711), and students of mixed race (N = 277).

More than three in five (62.1%) HACC students selected a career program as their academic major. Students in transfer programs were over a quarter (27.7%) of the population, while the remaining one in ten (10.2%) opted for General Studies. Compared to the previous spring, a higher proportion chose career programs (58.7% in 2009) while fewer decided on General Studies (13.5% in 2009).

By program, the most popular career majors were the RN and LPN (Nursing) programs followed by Business Management. Business Administration, followed by Elementary Education and Criminal Justice, were the largest transfer majors by enrollment.

### Harrisburg Campus

Growth at the Harrisburg Campus did not match the college-wide increase, but it was still up by 8.4% (2009 = 9,490 vs. 2010 = 10,287). The largest increase came from FT students, who were up 10.8% (2009 = 3,671 vs. 2010 = 4,069), while the PT segment rose by 6.9% (2009 = 5,819 vs. 2010 = 6,218). The FTE total was 10.5% higher, again reflecting the higher growth among the FT population.

By gender, female enrollment was much higher than their male peers, as the former group comprised 58.3% (5,997/10,287) of the campus HC. However, on a campus-by-campus review, the Harrisburg location registered the smallest percentage of females.

Hispanic students were about one in twenty (602/10,287 or 5.9%) of the population, below the college-wide average of 8.3%. One in five (2,094/10,287 or 20.4%) were minorities, with African Americans the largest group (N = 1,419), followed by Asians (N = 401) and mixed race (N = 139).

Program distribution by major found a large majority choosing a career major (63.5%), with three in ten (29.0%) enrolled in a transfer curriculum. The smallest percentage (7.5%) of General Studies students were found at the Harrisburg Campus.

The most popular majors looked very much like those cited college-wide. For those transferring, Business Administration, Criminal Justice, and Elementary Education were the largest. Nursing (both RN and LPN) plus Business Management led the career choices.

### **Gettysburg Campus**

The Gettysburg Campus grew at a significantly higher rate than the college-wide totals. Overall, the 2010 HC was 25.8% higher (2009 = 1,674 vs. 2010 = 2,108), with the PT figure up by 23.0% (2009 = 1,158 vs. 2010 = 1,424). FT enrollment rose by a very strong 32.2% (2009 = 516 vs. 2010 = 682). As expected, the FTE grew by 25.8% (2009 = 1,107.8 vs. 2010 = 1,393.2).

More than two in three (1,454/2,106 or 68.1%) students were females, maintaining the long-running dominance this group has on Gettysburg enrollment. Another trait long associated with this campus is the relatively low percentages of both ethnic Hispanic students and racial minorities.

For the former, 5.6% (N = 118) identified themselves as Hispanics, the lowest proportion of any location. In terms of minorities, these students constituted 6.9% of the campus total (N = 145), with African Americans (N = 61) and Asians (N = 30) the two largest groups. The lower minority representation generally mirrors the totals associated with Adams County where the number of non-Whites have historically been very small.

Very little change was uncovered with the choice of programs made by students. Again, three in five (59.1%) selected a career major while just over one in five (22.2%) were in a transfer program. The remainder (18.7%) was enrolled in General Studies.

When specific programs were considered, the two Nursing (RN and LPN) plus Business Management were the most popular career choices while Elementary Education, Business Administration, and Criminal Justice enrolled the most transfer majors.

### Lancaster Campus

Enrollment at the Lancaster Campus was up a robust 9.2% (2009 = 4,621 vs. 2010 = 5,047). However, unlike the other locations, PT rather than FT enrollment provided most of the growth. The number of PT students increased by 9.5% (2009 = 3,007 vs. 2010 = 3,294) compared to the 8.6% rise in FT students (2009 = 1,614 vs. 2010 = 1,753). The higher HC resulted in an 11.0% growth in FTEs (2009 = 3,124.7 vs. 2010 = 3,469.3).

By gender, nearly two-thirds (3,333/5,047 or 66.0%) of all students were females. This closely mirrored last year's percentage (67.7%) and continues a long-held pattern whereby females comprised the bulk of the enrollment.

The Hispanic population at Lancaster was the largest of any campus (656/5,047 or 13.0%) and this reflects in large part their concentration in the county census. More than one in six (889/5,047 or 17.6%) were racial minorities, with African Americans (N = 471) the largest followed by Asians (N = 202), and American Indians (N = 83).

Adhering to the pattern found at the other campuses, three in five (61.5%) students selected a career major. Over a quarter (28.6%) enrolled in a transfer program while the remainder (9.9%) opted for General Studies.

The most popular career majors were the RN (Nursing) program, Radiologic Technology, and then the LPN (Nursing) curriculum. On the transfer side, Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice were the largest. Very little has changed from the previous year, even with the significant enrollment growth.

### Lebanon Campus

Nearly all of the enrollment increases at the Lebanon Campus can be attributed to the growth in FT HC (2009 = 380 vs. 2010 = 443, or 16.6%) rather than the PT totals (2009 = 792 vs. 2010 = 827 or 4.4%). This resulted in an overall enrollment expansion of 8.4% (2009 = 1,172 vs. 2010 = 1,270), with a corresponding FTE growth of 13.3% (2009 = 736.1 vs. 2010 = 834.2).

Females constituted three in five (60.8%) of the population, a total similar to the other locations. By ethnicity, about one in eight (12.4%) students was Hispanic, which again is due in part to the fairly large Hispanic population that settled in Lebanon County. African Americans comprised the largest racial minority group (N = 68), followed by American Indians (N = 24) and then Asians (N = 17).

On a program-by-program review, over half (55.4%) of the Lebanon students selected a career major. Nearly a quarter (24.4%) enrolled in a transfer program while a fifth (20.5%) chose General Studies. The percentage selecting General Studies was the highest of any campus.

By program, the leading career majors were RN (Nursing), Business Studies, and the United Brotherhood of Carpenters Apprentice Program. Similar to the other locations, the top transfer programs were Elementary Education, Criminal Justice, and Business Administration.

### York Campus

As the newest HACC campus, it came as no surprise that York HC rose a very strong 18.3% (2009 = 2,406 vs. 2010 = 2,846). The number of FT students was up by 36.3% (2009 = 753 vs. 2010 = 1,026) while PT HC increased by a more modest 10.1% (2009 = 1,653 vs. 2010 = 1,820). Corresponding to the high increase in FT students, total FTE was 23.3% higher when compared to the previous spring (2009 = 1,602.1 vs. 2010 = 1,973.0).

Females constituted more than seven out of every ten students (71.0%), the highest proportion of any location. Interestingly, the 2010 percentage of females at York was actually lower than in 2009 (73.5%).

The proportion of Hispanics at York came to 8.9% of the total, the third highest among the campuses. However, when minority enrollment was reviewed, York had the highest proportion at 21.5%. This was comprised of a large number of African Americans (N = 447), reflecting the demographic traits of the York City census. Asians (N = 61) and mixed race (N = 46) followed in group size.

Similar to all campuses, a majority (63.4%) of all students selected one of the career programs while over a quarter (27.2%) of the total enrolled in one of the transfer majors. Just under one in ten (9.4%) chose General Studies.

Again, consistent with the other campuses, the two Nursing programs (RN & LPN) followed by Business Management were the most popular majors. On the transfer side, Criminal Justice, Business Administration, and Elementary Education enrolled the largest groups of students.

### **Summary**

Overall enrollment remained very strong as total HC rose at all campuses and was up by 11.3% college-wide. Especially high growth was associated with the Gettysburg (25.8%) and York (18.3%) locations.

Females again constituted nearly two-thirds (64.9%) of the total as large majorities were found at each campus. The percentage of Hispanics and racial minorities varied from campus to campus. For the former, the proportion of Hispanics ranged from a low of 5.6% (Gettysburg) to a high of 13.0% (Lancaster), with a college-wide total of 8.3%. Likewise, the percentage of racial minorities ranged from 6.9% (Gettysburg) to 21.5% (York), with a college-wide average of 18.0%.

Career programs proved once again to be the most popular, with the two Nursing majors (RN and LPN) plus Business Management leading the way. On the transfer side, Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice were the most popular.

### Appendix – Virtual Campus

Enrollment continued to expand for Virtual Campus courses as the number of students rose by 11.4% (2009 = 4,896 vs. 2010 = 5,452). This in turn resulted in a 12.7% increase in course registration (2009 = 7,789 vs. 2010 = 8,780) and a 12.4% growth in credits generated (2009 = 23,158 vs. 2010 = 26,028).

Females continued to provide a large majority of Virtual students as they comprised 69.3% of the Spring 2010 total (2009 = 72.2%). By ethnicity, Hispanics represented 5.9% of the total, nearly the same percentage as the previous year (2009 = 5.3%). Racial minorities were 13.7% of the total (vs. 13.4% in Spring 2009), with African Americans (N = 455) the largest group, then Asians (N = 132) and mixed race (N = 81). The mean age of a Virtual Campus student was 28.4 years.

Interestingly, just over a third (34.2%) enrolled in virtual courses only, as a large majority was also registered for traditional classroom courses. It appears that many taking traditional courses also wanted the scheduling flexibility of an online offering. The virtual-only student percentage changed little from 2009 (35.3%).

Another salient point regarding virtual courses is the home county of the students enrolled. More than four in five (83.8%) came from the five local counties of Dauphin, York, Cumberland, Lancaster, and Lebanon. While this did not differ greatly from the past year (84.0%), the data showed that distance education students are not that far away geographically.

Finally, the most popular academic majors for career students were RN (Nursing), Business Management, and Computer Information Systems. For transfer students, Business Administration, Elementary Education, and Criminal Justice enrolled the largest numbers.

In summary, the Virtual Campus retained its double digit growth, though rate increases have slowed in recent years. This may be due in part to the Virtual Campus reaching its saturation; the limits placed on the number and types of courses offered; and its limited marketing efforts. Regardless of these concerns, with more than 5,000 students, the Virtual Campus serves many in the local community.
