

Lebanon Campus Scholarships

Goal: \$250,000

For more than 25 years, HACC's Lebanon Campus has provided access to higher education for many people who would otherwise struggle to go to college. With nearly 1,200 students, the campus is a vital component in workforce development in Lebanon County.

Investing in Lebanon Campus scholarships is investing in both the students and a robust, vibrant future for Lebanon County.



English Language Learners (ELL)/English as a Second Language (ESL) Workforce Scholarship

The Hispanic community represents 34 percent of Lebanon County's population. By establishing this workforce scholarship, the Lebanon Campus is able to test and enroll local residents in its ELL/ESL Program at a reduced or no cost to the participants. During the program's first year, staff tested more than 80 future students and enrolled 60 students. Of these students, 10 percent are now focused on enrolling at HACC full time.

Information Technology Scholarship

This scholarship will not only draw technology-oriented students to the Lebanon Campus, it will also draw students with a creative flair to participate in Web Development and Design or Graphic and Interactive Design programs.

John Worrilow Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship honors the memory of John Worrilow, who served as the mayor of Lebanon for seven years. It provides much-needed scholarship assistance to students who attend HACC's Lebanon Campus.

Lebanon Campus New and Existing Funds

Additional contributions would allow HACC to award scholarships to more eligible students. New scholarship funds in honor or memory of a family member, friend, professor or organization will help HACC recruit and retain students who would not otherwise be able to afford higher education

Manufacturing Scholarship

The Lebanon Campus' new Welding Program and other manufacturing offerings directly meet local needs in manufacturing and mining production. The Manufacturing Scholarship enables the campus to attract top-notch students to enroll in related programs and support local manufacturers that rely on talented welders and shop workers for their workforce.
