1.	How will I know if I was selected to be a Johnson Controls Scholar?	Johnson Controls Scholars will be notified of their status (regardless of outcome) in late November 2023. If you are not selected to be a Johnson Controls Scholar, you will be directed to other amazing opportunities to start and fund YOUR HACC journey.
2.	Are these programs available in the evening or online?	Evening courses are available in the following programs:  a. Electrical Technology b. Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) c. Welding  In the HVAC and Electrical Technology programs, some courses are offered in a hybrid format, meaning some content is taught online to supplement the hands-on lab activities.
3.	Is this opportunity available to current or future students?	This opportunity is available for current and future HACC students.
4.	Do I need to be a full-time student, or is this opportunity available to part-time students?	This opportunity is available for part-time and full-time students.
5.	How long do I have to complete these programs? Is it a year round program?	a. A full-time student can complete the welding diploma in one semester. b. Full-time students can complete the Electrical Technology, HVAC, Mechatronics and Welding certificate programs in one year. c. Full-time students can complete the Electrical Technology, HVAC, and Mechatronics AAS programs in two years.

		The majority of HACC students take classes part time. During the 2022-23 academic year, we introduced an accelerated scheduling model in all the skilled trades programs. This scheduling model encourages students to enroll in seven-week terms rather than the traditional 15-week semester.
6.	What if I decide to change my major to a program that is not included in the Johnson Control Scholars Program?	You will no longer be part of the Johnson Controls Scholars Program and thus will not receive the benefits associated with the program.
7.	What happens if I am unable to complete the program and need to drop my courses?	You will no longer be part of the Johnson Controls Scholars Program and thus will not receive the benefits associated with the program.
8.	If I am a current student, how can I change my major to a program in the Johnson Control Scholars Program?	Please use this form to change your major.
9.	If I'm not chosen, how else can I pay for school?	There are many ways to fund your HACC education. Please visit these web pages to learn more:  • Applying for Aid • Apply for HACC Scholarships
10.	Can I still participate if I am an adult learner?	Absolutely! Adult learners and nontraditional students are eligible and encouraged to apply.
11.	Do I have to start in the spring?	All selected Johnson Control Scholars must enroll at HACC no later than the start of the summer 2024 semester.
12.	If I am chosen as a scholar but need to change my admit term, can I change my start date or will I need to apply for this program and be randomly selected again?	If you are selected as a Johnson Controls Scholar, you are required to start your classes no later than the summer 2024 semester. If you are unable to start your classes by summer 2024, you will no longer be

		eligible for the program or funds.
13.	When do I have to start my classes?	If you are selected as a Johnson Controls Scholar, you are required to start your classes no later than the summer 2024 semester. If you are unable to start your classes by summer 2024, you will no longer be eligible for the program or funds.
14.	Is the \$2,500 scholarship granted for one semester or for the entire academic year?	This is a one-time scholarship. Additional scholarships may be available in the future. However, there is no guarantee.
