## **Myths of Online Learning**

Still, there exist misconceptions about online learning and you have questions. Keep reading for answers, as here HACC debunks some of the most common myths of online learning....

#### Myth #1: Students have to teach themselves the material.

Your instructors at HACC are a highly visible and involved part of your online courses! As in the in-person classroom, their primary concern is the teaching and engagement of students. HACC online instructors are well-trained and well-versed in the best practices in instructional design and online teaching. They deliver lectures and content in various formats, and reinforce concepts through additional guided learning activities. HACC instructors personally design course materials such as syllabi, assignments, assessments, videos, interactive discussions, and even group projects - all with the goal of promoting student learning and success.

# Myth #2: Online Courses Don't Provide the Same Level of Interaction with Instructors or Other Students

Online courses typically require a certain level of class interactivity from students with the intention of helping them be successful. Online faculty offer office hours during which they meet with students via video conferencing, phone calls, chat, or text messaging. In some courses, students participate in group activities and use collaborative tools like Skype or Zoom to confer with each other.

Also, online students participate in HACC clubs, organizations, and forums. They access all the activities and services available to members of the student body taking inperson courses, such as athletics, career services, advising, and tutoring. #### Myth #3: You can't earn a degree online.

#### Myth #4: Employers don't value online education.

Employers respect online learning. According to U.S. News, 95% of human resources managers report that they would hire candidates who have taken online courses. When considering candidates, most employers look at a variety of factors: first impressions; work history; educational experience; etc. As online education becomes more and more common, employers are able to cite a growing body of evidence of its effectiveness. An added benefit of online learning is that the skills it teaches students, such as familiarity with technology and online communication and collaboration, are increasingly valued in the workplace.

### Myth #5: Online courses are of a lower quality.

Sometimes prospective students assume that the online learning experience could never compete with the in-person experience. They fear that they won't find the same level of quality and support. But the percentage of students enrolled in online courses keeps rising, suggesting the quality of the experience. Online courses at HACC adhere to academic standards and accreditation requirements. Students are expected to complete course activities just as they do in the in-person environment, and as they do so they gain valuable time management and self-motivation skills. They easily access support as needed from HACC instructional technology professionals, as well as from our librarians, tutors, and Access Services.

#### Myth #6: All online courses are self-paced...and that's bad!

While it is true that there are self-paced online educational opportunities out there, many more programs are structured similarly to those at on-site institutions. This is the case at HACC. There is a structure to online courses, with teachers delivering instruction and students completing work according to prescribed schedules. Students do have flexibility within the specifications of the schedule - and they find that the control they are able to exercise over their schedules significantly aids in their learning and performance.

#### Myth #7: You have to be a "tech wiz" to take an online course.

Most online learning platforms require only basic knowledge about computers, as they are designed to be straightforward and user-friendly. Of course, all new skills take practice!
