1. How does Governor Wolf's decision to penalize Lebanon County by withholding CARES Act funding impact HACC?

HACC's allocation of the <u>CARES Act</u> is part of the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund that is directly allocated from the U.S. Department of Education. This money is separate and distinct from the CARES Act monies that Governor Wolf has withdrawn from Lebanon County. Therefore, this does not impact HACC.

2. Has HACC looked into the grant of \$3-an-hour hazard pay recently announced by the state? Is this something our facilities and security workers would qualify for?

HACC does not meet the eligibility requirements set by the state through the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act and administered by the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED).
