1. Why are we now listing programs instead of specific courses on the website for the hands-on components?

We are working through the details of which courses can be completed fully remotely and which courses have parts that require a hands-on demonstration of skills. Once we work through those details, we plan to organize the list of courses by program and oncampus protocol.

2. If a student contracts COVID-19 during the fall term, will they get their money back?

Students who face unexpected circumstances, including an illness such as COVID-19, have several options. The student's faculty may determine that an incomplete grade is appropriate to allow the student additional time to finish coursework beyond the semester's end. If an incomplete grade is not appropriate, students can complete an application to request a <u>Retroactive Withdraw/Return of Tuition Credit</u>.

3. Will Federal Work-Study (FWS) students continue to be paid after June 30, 2020?

Based on federal guidance, Federal Work-Study (FWS) students will not be paid after June 30, 2020, unless they are actively working for the College.

4. Should I be listing Zoom links on social media and the College's website?

To avoid <u>Zoom bombing</u>, please do not list Zoom information publicly. We recommend providing an email address or online form where individuals can register for events. The necessary follow-up and information can be supplied once the registration has been received.
