- 4. I understand that we will follow the guidance of the Pennsylvania Department of Health and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) when we are able to open. What will our protocol be if students or employees become infected with COVID-19 while on a HACC campus? Will we shut down buildings if a certain number of occupants are infected? How will we prevent an outbreak on campus?

The College has established a task force comprised of individuals from across the institution and all constituency groups to develop recommendations for fall 2020. The task force is taking into account recommendations for social distancing, personal protective equipment (PPE) and mitigation procedures from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and government and public health officials. These considerations include possible reductions in class size. More details will be provided to the Cabinet in the coming weeks, and decisions will be shared with the College community shortly thereafter.
