1. As the administration discusses the possibility of a return to campuses in the fall, what has been discussed in regard to complying with social distancing guidelines?

The College has established a task force comprised of individuals from across the institution and all constituency groups to develop recommendations for fall 2020. The task force is taking into account recommendations for social distancing, personal protective equipment (PPE) and mitigation procedures from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and government and public health officials. These considerations include possible reductions in class size. More details will be provided to the Cabinet in the coming weeks, and decisions will be shared with the College community shortly thereafter.

2. What training opportunities will be available to faculty this summer to learn about using technology resources for remote teaching?

3. Does the floating holiday for July 4 apply to full-time employees who work Monday through Thursday?

Yes. According to <u>SGP 814 Attendance</u>, <u>Absences and Holidays</u>, "If the Independence Day holiday falls on a day when the College is closed, employees will be granted a floating holiday. The floating holiday may be used anytime between July 1 and July 31 with the supervisor's approval and must be documented on the web timesheet."
