Lethal Weapons ACT 235 Certification, Certificate - Noncredit

Law Enforcement - Office of Academic Affairs & Workforce Development CIP Code: 430107

Provides students with the skills needed to develop knowledge of the critical nature surrounding the use of force, as it applies to Certified Agents. Justification for the use of force, as it pertains to the protection of life and property, is covered. Students are taught the safe handling of firearms and are able to demonstrate their proficiency by firing a 12-gauge shotgun and meet qualification standards with a handgun.

This course consists of 22-hours of classroom instruction, four (4) hours of armed and unarmed defense, and 14 hours of firearms training. Participants must successfully pass a written examination on the classroom portion and a firearms qualification on the range. Students who successfully complete the course are certified by Pennsylvania State Police (PSP).

Classes are held at the Senator Jeffrey E. Piccola Law Enforcement Complex at HACC's Harrisburg Campus through on-campus/in-person instruction. Interested students should contact the Law Enforcement Training Unit at HACC's email: policetrng@hacc.edu.
