The Entrepreneurship diploma program is designed to prepare students to understand the role that entrepreneurship plays in a diverse world from personal self-assessment through the creation and presentation of a feasibility study. Students acquire the knowledge and skills to become an entrepreneur in a start-up business, existing business, government or a non-profit organization. Skills developed in marketing, management and finance lead to the creation of a sound business plan. This diploma offers students the opportunity to choose one program elective in a focused area. This diploma may be completed entirely through asynchronous instruction.
