The Film and Theatre Associate in Fine Arts degree prepares students for entry-level employment within film and theatre production companies. This hands-on curriculum teaches students fundamental knowledge and techniques essential to acting and working in the many technical areas that relate to the film and theatre industries. With an emphasis on resume building skills, and a conservatory approach, students choose either an acting or technical concentration. Students pursuing the **Acting Concentration** gain skills in acting techniques, character development, voice and movement, as well as improvisation. Those selecting the **Technical Concentration** obtain skills in lighting, editing, camera operation, production design, as well as script writing and analysis. All students participate in practicum and capstone experience courses that culminate in either the presentation of a performance piece or a professional portfolio. While this program is designed to prepare students for entry-level employment, it may also serve to transfer to many four-year institutions and professional film and theatre schools. This program can be completed at the Harrisburg Campus through on-campus/in-person instruction.

Career or Transfer Opportunities

Training is provided in both acting and technical production for entry-level job opportunities within film and theatre production companies, as well as for transferring to four-year institutions, or professional film and theatre schools. In addition, this program may be taken for personal growth or for advancement by those already employed in some aspect of the film and theatre industries.

Competency Profile

This curriculum is designed to prepare the student to:

- Distinguish between the various roles and functions that performers, directors, designers and technicians play within the film and theater arts
- Recognize the necessity for collaboration and artistic compromise across all roles and functions with in film and theatre
- Execute the various tasks involved in creating a film and/or staged production
- Create a performance resume or technical portfolio
- Write and speak effectively about the nature of film and theatre
