On Nov. 3, 2025, the union representing our credit faculty commenced a lawful strike at the Harrisburg Campus, beginning at 12:01 a.m. Please see the College's statement <a href="here">here</a>. We respect the rights of our faculty to engage in this process. However, as always, our primary focus must remain on maintaining College operations to support our students and their education.

We recognize that this situation presents unique challenges. Your role in maintaining operations and supporting our students during this time is critically important and deeply appreciated.

Please note the following:

- Full-time and adjunct faculty who choose to strike will NOT be compensated for the duration of the strike and may lose access to certain benefits including health insurance.
- Please complete <u>this form</u> immediately to indicate your work intentions. **If you have** already completed the <u>attestation</u> form, you do NOT need to submit it again.
- The College is collecting information on employees willing to serve as substitute
  instructors during the strike. We thank those who have volunteered and continue to be
  encouraged by the number of instructors who have previously completed the form.
  Those who serve will be compensated accordingly. To volunteer, please complete the
  survey using your HACC email account.
- Non-union employees are expected to report to work as scheduled.
